

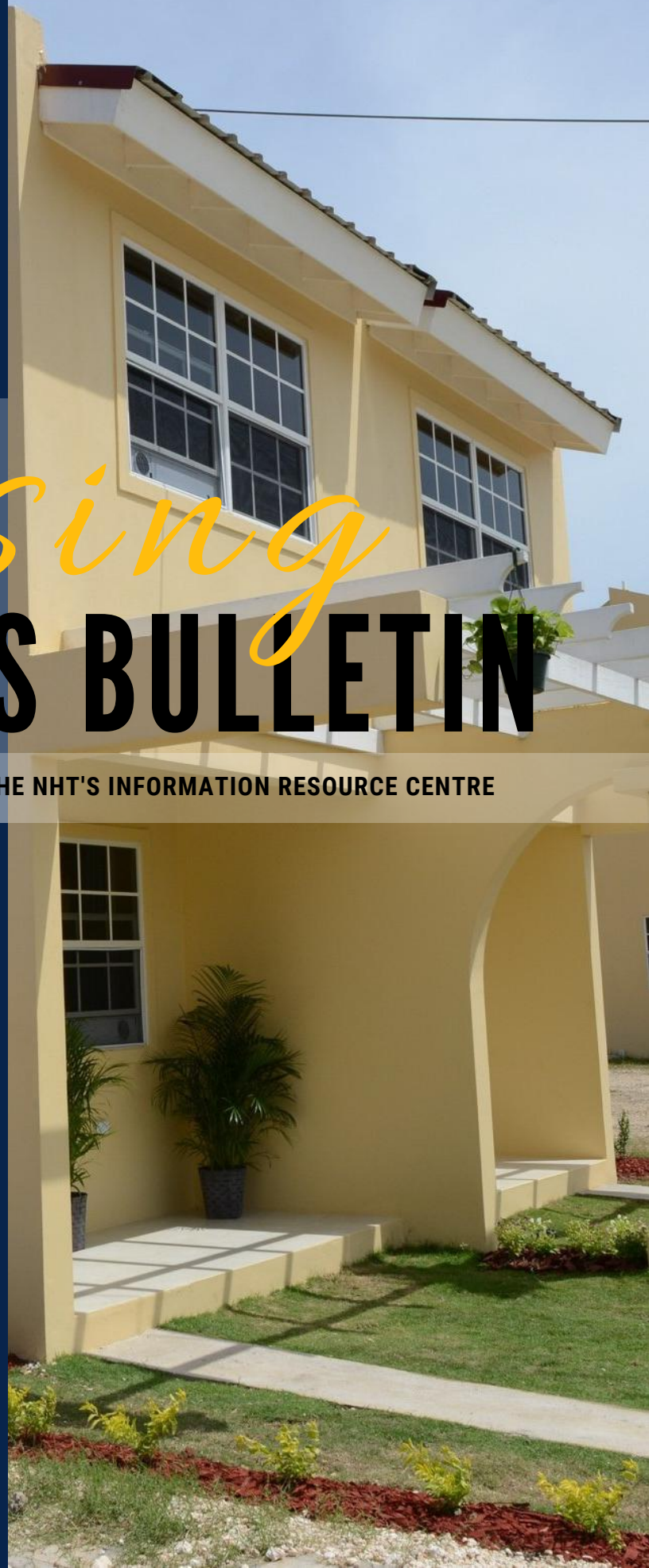

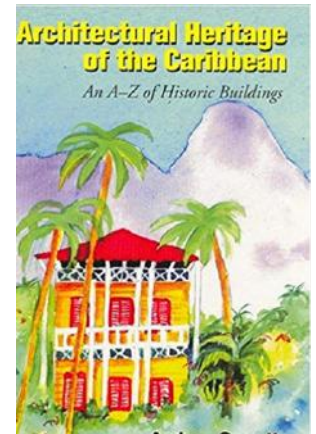

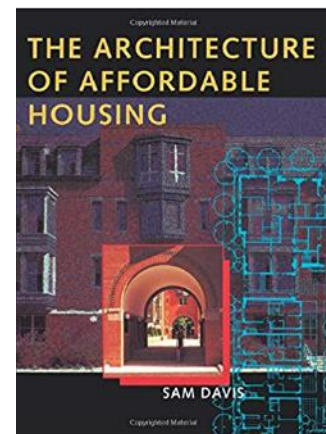
Architectural heritage of the Caribbean: an A-Z of historic buildings / by Andrew Gravette. Jamaica: Ian Randle Publishers, 2000, 340p.

Abstract: This text features over 1,000 architectural sites across the region and describes churches, plantation houses, fortresses, and ordinary homes. Illustrated with color plates, the publication also traces the historic and economic developments which have created the region's unique Creole styles. It includes a glossary of architectural terms.



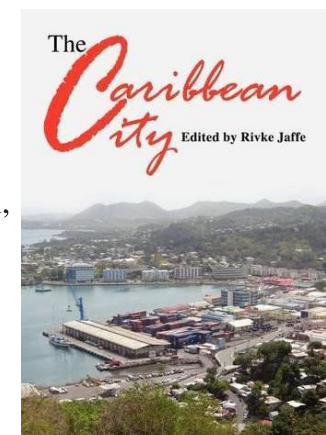
The architecture of affordable housing / by Sam Davis. Berkeley: University of California Press, 1997, 208p.

Abstract: This book is about the design of dignified, affordable housing for those not served by the private sector, and how that housing fits comfortably into our communities. Through discussions of cost, politics, and design concepts, as well as case studies of completed projects, solutions are given to the dilemmas posed by the development process.



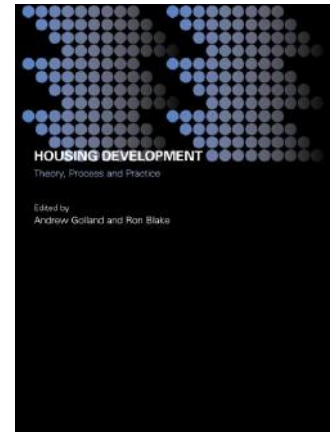
The Caribbean city / by Rivke Jaffe. Jamaica: Ian Randle Publishers, 2008, 358p.

Abstract: This text presents a detailed introduction on spatial, socio-cultural and economic characteristics of the Caribbean city, followed by case studies of various cities in the Dutch, Hispanic, Francophone and Anglophone Caribbean. The text approaches these cities from an interdisciplinary perspective, incorporating approaches from Anthropology, Sociology, History, Political Science, Geography, and Literary and Cultural criticism.



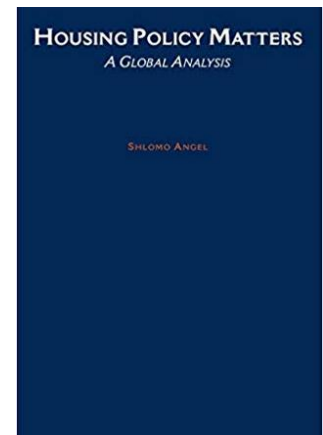
Housing development: theory, process and practice / by Andrew Golland and Ron Blake. London: Routledge, 2004, 410p.

Abstract: This publication brings together information on housing production, housing provision and the housing environment, highlighting the theoretical and policy contexts in which housing development takes place as an integrated process. 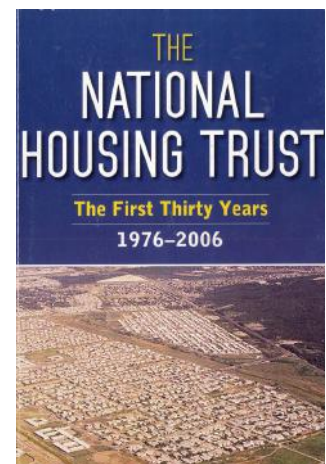
Housing policy matters: a global analysis / by Shlomo Angel. New York: Oxford University Press, 2000, 418p.

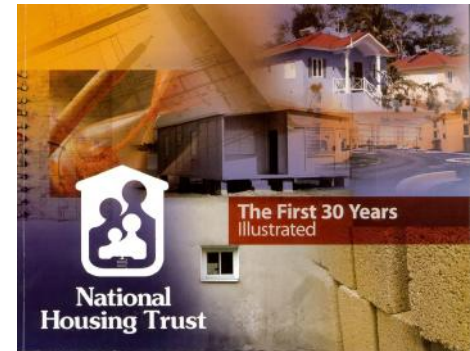
The National Housing Trust: the first thirty years: 1976 - 2006 / by National Housing Trust. Jamaica: National Housing Trust, 2016, 220p.

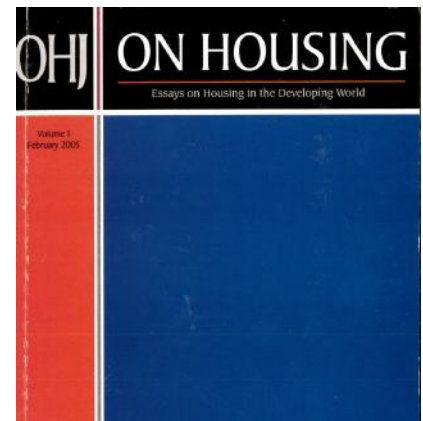
National Housing Trust: the first 30 years illustrated / by National Housing Trust. Jamaica: National Housing Trust, 2016, 104p.

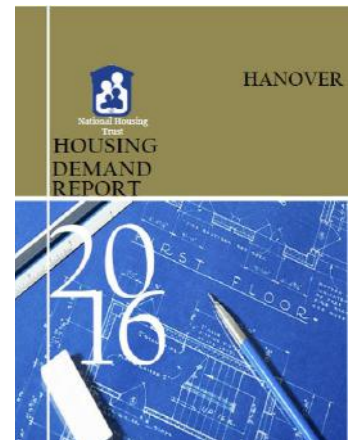
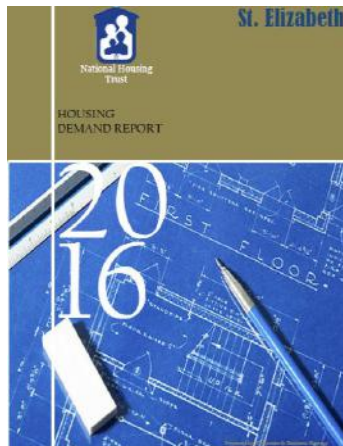
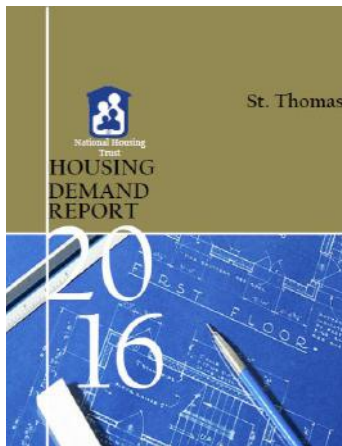


Sustainable community: learning from the cohousing model / by Graham Meltzer. USA: Trafford Publishing, 2005, 179p.

Abstract: This publication explores the link between ‘sustainability’ and ‘community’. It is based on a 10-year study of cohousing, a popular new type of planned residential community that addresses pressing environmental and social needs. It uses data from twelve cohousing developments in Canada, the US, New Zealand, Australia and Japan – concrete examples of successful sustainable communities.
